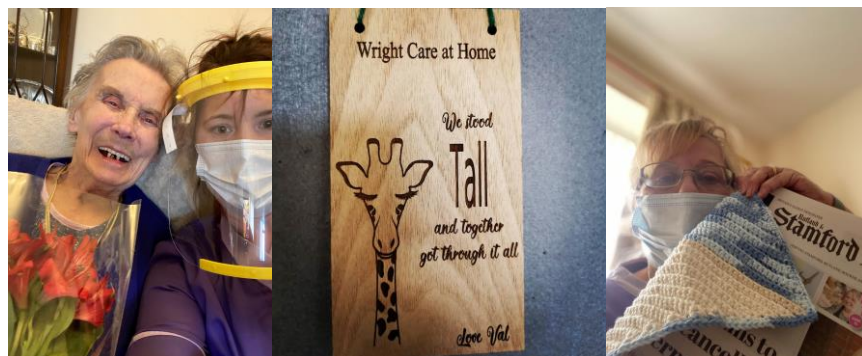
Acts of Kindness continuing this week.....
