Established in 2015, Second Helpings, Stamford, aims to reduce food waste by using food gifted from local sources that would otherwise go to landfill. The Bunker is run by volunteers on a Pay-as-you-Feel basis, serving the needs of local people from all walks of life regardless of the ability to pay. They are playing a vital role in supporting the Stamford community at a time when so many people may be facing food poverty. The Bunker is currently located at the Methodist Church Hall in Barn Hill/North Street
